

## CIRPASS-2 launches circular-data.org, a hub for the Digital Product Passport Community

The EU-funded <u>CIRPASS-2</u> project has launched the <u>CircularData ecosystem</u>, a networking tool for organisations involved in the Digital Circular Economy and in the development of the Digital Product Passport (DPPs). CircularData, hosted on the Clusterly platform by project partner <u>EKODENGE</u>, is a one-stop hub to connect, collaborate and co-create. This free, online networking space enables organisations to exchange knowledge, share DPP use cases, services, and innovations.



CircularData is not just another platform - it is a living ecosystem equipped with powerful tools to:

- Stay up to date with cluster-specific news feeds
